

MALT WHISKY LIST



Highland

Generally more full-bodied than their Speyside counterparts, Highland malts are rounded, firm and dry in character, with some peatiness.

Glenmorangie 10 yo £3.85

A lovely rounded fruity/floral malt with just a hint of peat.

Dalwhinnie 15 yo £4.35

A wholemeal and honey quality to the nose and the odd smoky tangent. A sweet, fruity core and a long round finish.

Oban 14 yo £4.60

Oban has a sweet, peated nose with nuances of burnt heather, carried through to the palate with just a touch of creaminess.

Speyside

Speyside is home to the sweetest style of whiskey. Rich and complex in flavour and often displaying fruity, honeyed characters and delicate aromas.

Macallan Gold £3.85

Orange rind, sweet dumpling and Christmas cake all combine on the nose and palate and are followed by butterscotch notes.

Balvenie DoubleWood 12 yo £4.60

An assertive, penetrating malt combining the classic spicy qualities of The Balvenie with softer, fruitier notes from its finishing period in ex-Sherry casks. Full bodied with a succulent, warming finish.

Cragganmore 12 yo £4.10

Smooth with apples, nuts, honey and hint of smokey peat.

Macallan Sherry Oak 18 yo £9.50

The Iconic Macallan -Rich deeply attractive nose -honeyed with prickling wood spice and brandy butter. Dried fruits with spice, clove, orange and wood smoke on the palate with a very smooth finish.

Lowland

Lowland malts have a gentle softness untempered by Highland peatiness or coastal brine and seaweed. They are light and pale, both in colour and style

Glenkinchie 10 yo £4.50

The Edinburgh malt Soft, spicy: cinnamon and, ginger. beautiful balance of sweetness and dryness.

Auchentoshan 10 yo £3.85

Floral, clean and fresh with hints of aniseed, raisins and a limey streak. Soft and fruity with tangerine freshness

Springbank 10 yo £5.50

Characterised by a salty tang, flavours range from citrus and pear, to vanilla, nutmeg and coconut, with an ever-present hint of smoke.

Islay

Arguably the greatest of all the whiskey producing islands. Its malts show a notable iodine, sea weedy quality and are fiery in nature-

you can taste the wind, rain and sea... 25ml glass

Laphroaig 10yo £4.35

Iodine, smoke and sea air abound on the nose with support from Satsuma, clove, ginger peel and vanilla pod aromas. Intense and concentrated on the palate with masses of complexity and a long, spicy finish.

Ardberg 10yo £4.75

Big, rich and peaty with a long dry finish, not as medicinal as some Islay's.

Lagavulin 16yo £5.35

A huge, dry, peaty style with hints of iodine and a long smooth finish. Notes of orange, toffee and heath all feature.

Bowmore Darkest 15yo £8.00

Bowmore is the original Islay distillery A rich burnt sienna colour, dark chocolate and raisin aromas compliment the classic Bowmore smokiness. Wonderful cedar wood and treacle toffee flavours with a robust warming finish.

Island

Island malts are characterised by a peaty, smoky nose and flavour, although they are diverse in character. Some, like Talisker, resemble Islay malts, others are more reminiscent of the Highland style.

Highland Park 12yo £3.90

A consistently high scorer in peer group tastings. Orkney's distillery presents a heather honey accent combined with a full rounded malty flavour.

Isle of Jura 10yo £4.00

A lovely aperitif. An oily, lightly piney, earthy, salty, dry nose. Sweetish, soft, malty, oily flavours slowly developing a slight island dryness and saltiness with a malty sweet finish.

Talisker 10 yo £3.85

From the only distillery on Skye, this dram is a biggie – hugely smoky and pungent on the nose, and spicy and peppery on the palate.
